## Travel Policy

The British School encourages pupils, parents and staff to make travel plans that are both sustainable and safe. Sustainable transport measures aim to reduce air pollution and congestion, improve access to the school, increase physical activity and improve safety for all. The British School community is encouraged to walk, cycle, use public transport and reduce car travel.

### Tram routes and stops

The tram stops are a 4 minute walk from the school.

#### Amstelveenseweg

Tram 2 from Nieuw Sloten.

Tram 2 from Central Station.

If arriving by Tram 2 from Nieuw Sloten, the Amstelveenseweg stop sets you down in the traffic, so please watch out for vehicles and cycles when disembarking.

If arriving by Tram 2 from Central Station, the only pedestrian crossing is at the lights at Amstelveenseweg/ Zeilstraat.

There is no pedestrian crossing here - Do not cross.









# Arriving by car

If you need to travel by car then please consider the options available ahead of time. There is no parking provided by the school but there is limited public paid parking. We strongly recommend that you familiarise yourself with the area to ensure safety for all.



Please always be mindful and respectful of our neighbours whilst driving and parking in the area of the school.

## Driver Guidelines

Where possible we would ask parents not to travel by car, but if necessary then please take note of the following;

### **Car Pool Update**

Sharing the commute to and from school will reduce congestion. To encourage more of our community to car pool we will be setting up a car pool notice board on Firefly.

#### Car Parking Guidelines

Please find local parking if:

- You have children in Nursery up to Year 4.
- You need to talk with a member of staff.
- Your child needs assistance to enter or leave school.

### Express (for pupils in Year 5 upwards) Kiss & Ride Zone Rules

- The Express Kiss & Ride Zone is not suitable for children in Year 4 or below.
- Pupils must be able to leave the car and enter school grounds INDEPENDENTLY (you may not leave your vehicle and there will NOT be any school staff on hand to assist).
- Pupils must be able to exit the school grounds and wait UNSUPERVISED for pick up (you may not leave your vehicle and there will NOT be any school staff on hand to assist).
- This a strictly a NO PARKING ZONE.
- Drivers may not leave the vehicle unattended. if you need to come in to school you will need to park elsewhere.
- There is no waiting in this zone, only stop in this zone when your child is ready to enter the vehicle.

### Parking your car

Car

There is a small paid for car park, down a lane, a 3 minute walk from the school.

Parking charges are €6 per hour Ρ (free if you have a residential parking permit for parking zones Zuid 2 and Zuid 8).





There is strictly no parking in the taxi rank.
