Travel Policy

The British School encourages pupils, parents and staff to make travel plans that are both sustainable and safe. Sustainable transport measures aim to reduce air pollution and congestion, improve access to the school, increase physical activity and improve safety for all. The British School community is encouraged to walk, cycle, use public transport and reduce car travel.

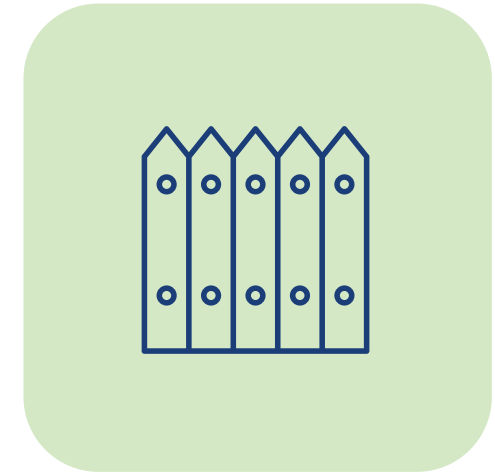

Gates & Pedestrians

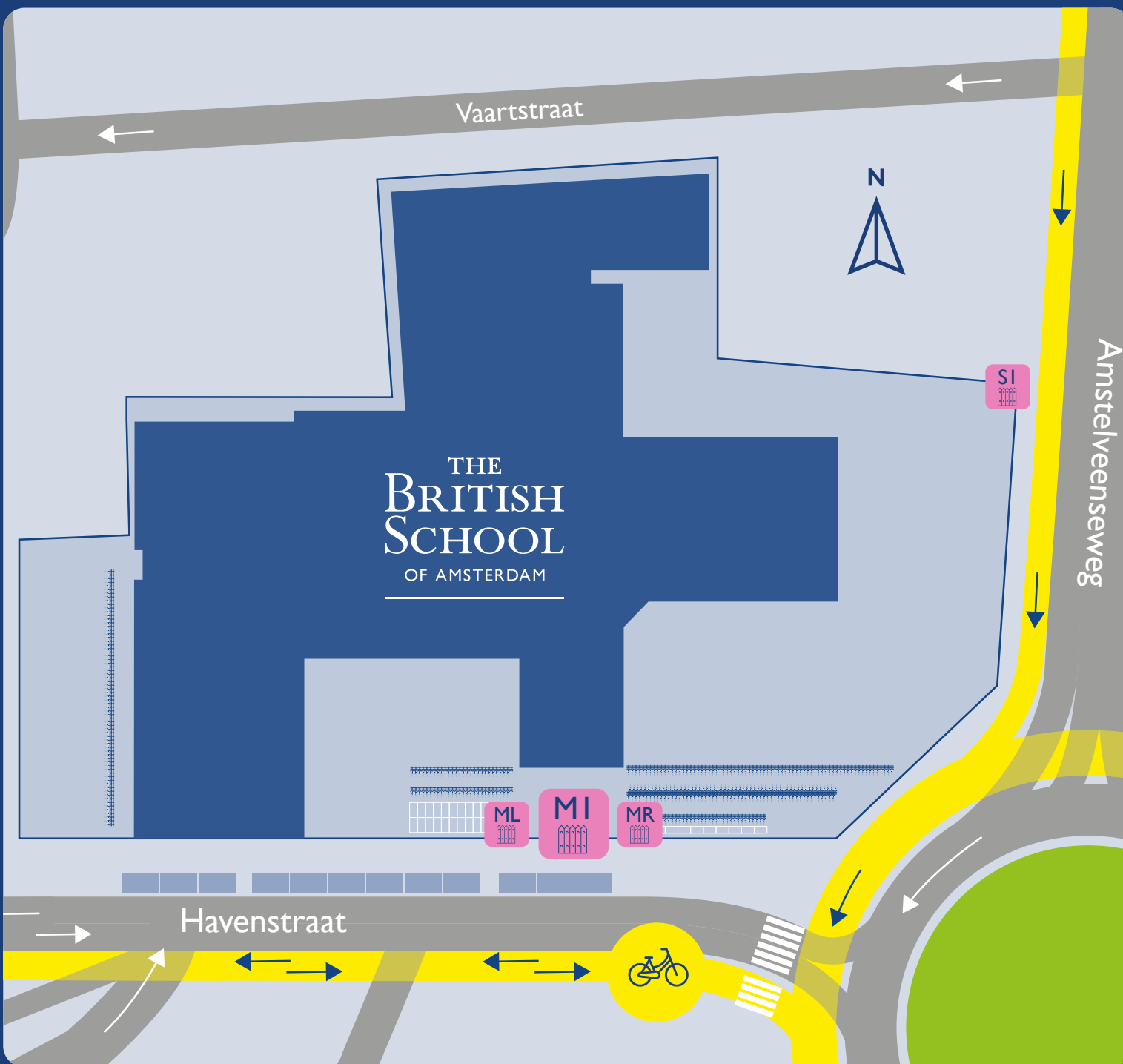

Main Left

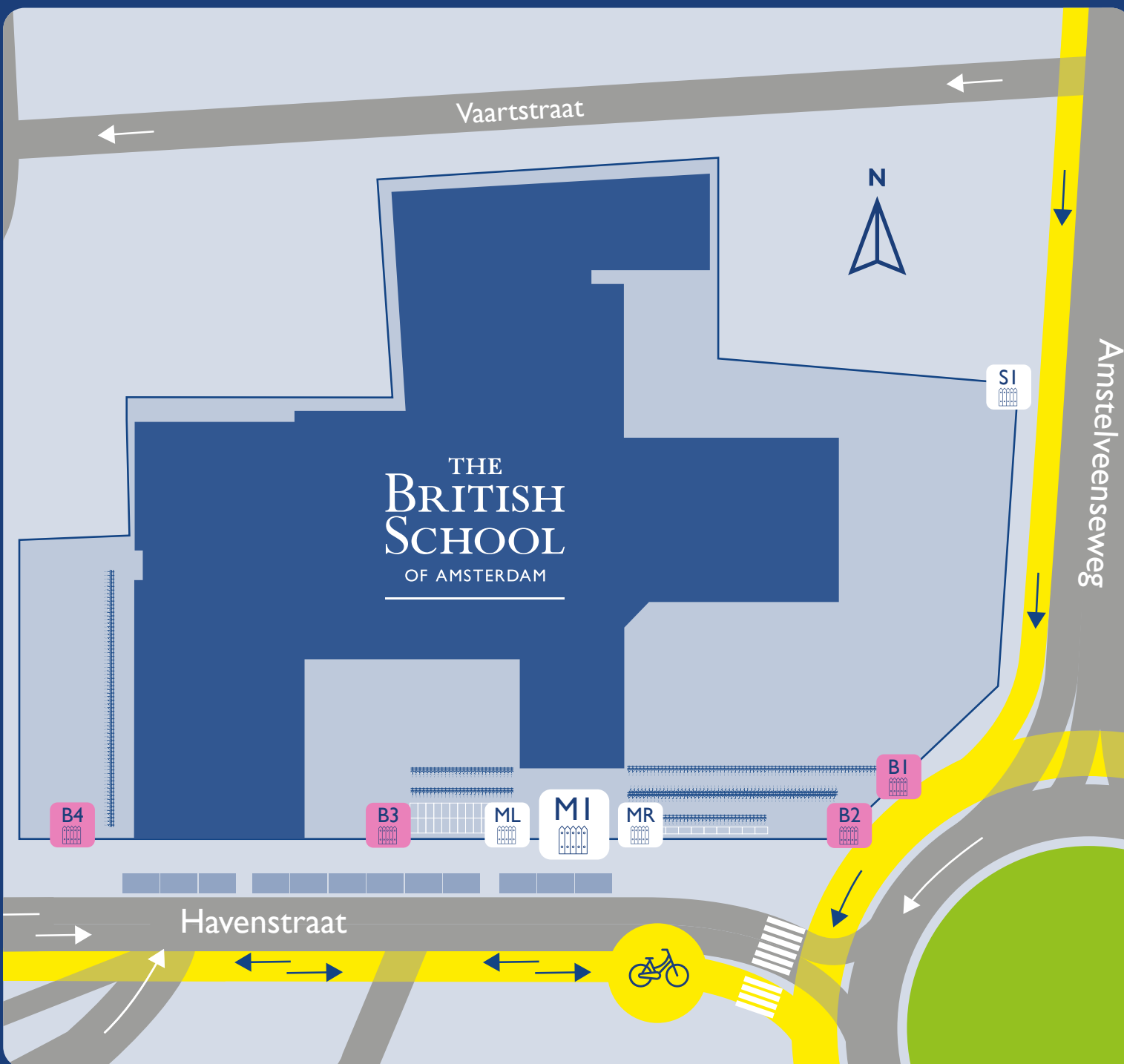

B3 Bike 3

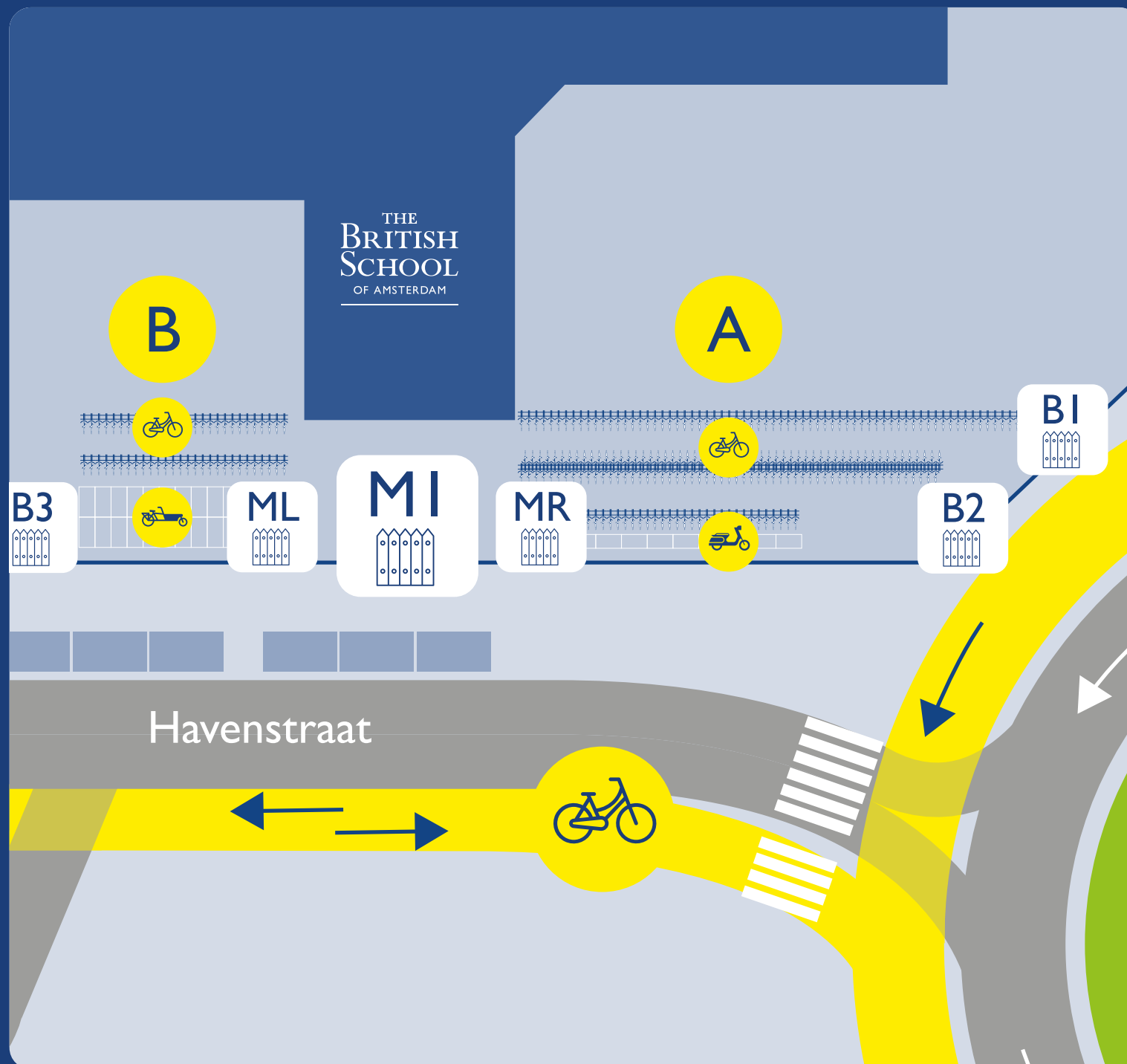
Ideal for those on bakfiets needing short term parking.

Bike parking

There are designated areas for bike parking at the front of the school.

A Pupil Parking

Primarily for use by Junior and Senior School pupils.

B Drop off & Visitor Parking

Primarily for drop off with bakfiets.



Pedestrian crossing

Please use the designated crossings on the roundabout.



Do not cross here - there is no pedestrian crossing.



Use the zebra crossings.



Raised crossing here - no zebra crossing.

Cycling to school is a great option but caution must be taken especially when approaching the roundabout. Please review all the details highlighted in the following maps to plan your safest route to school.

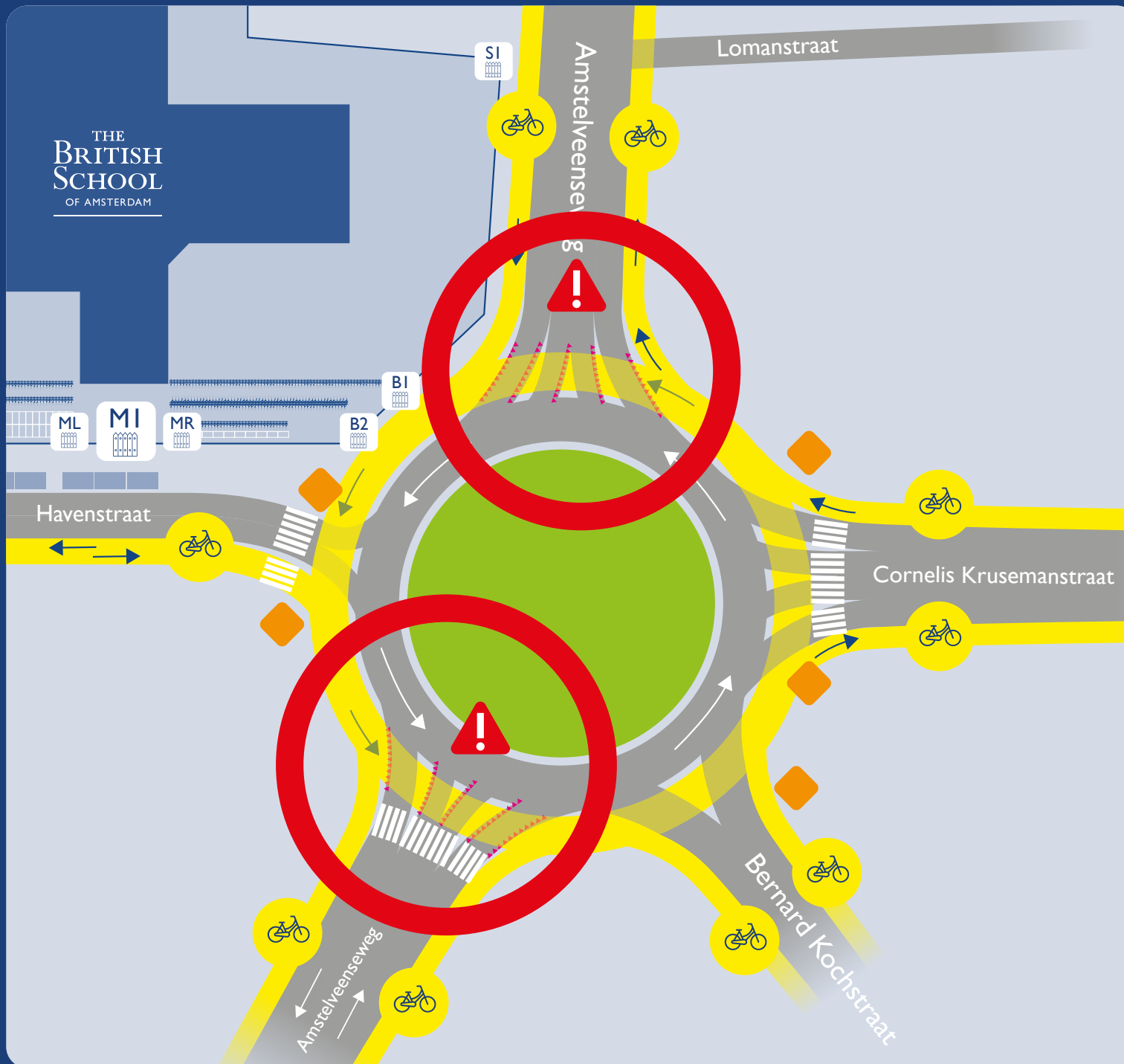

Yields and right of way

Please take note of the safety measures below:



Always YIELD

STOP to cars, trams, buses or other cyclists at these points.



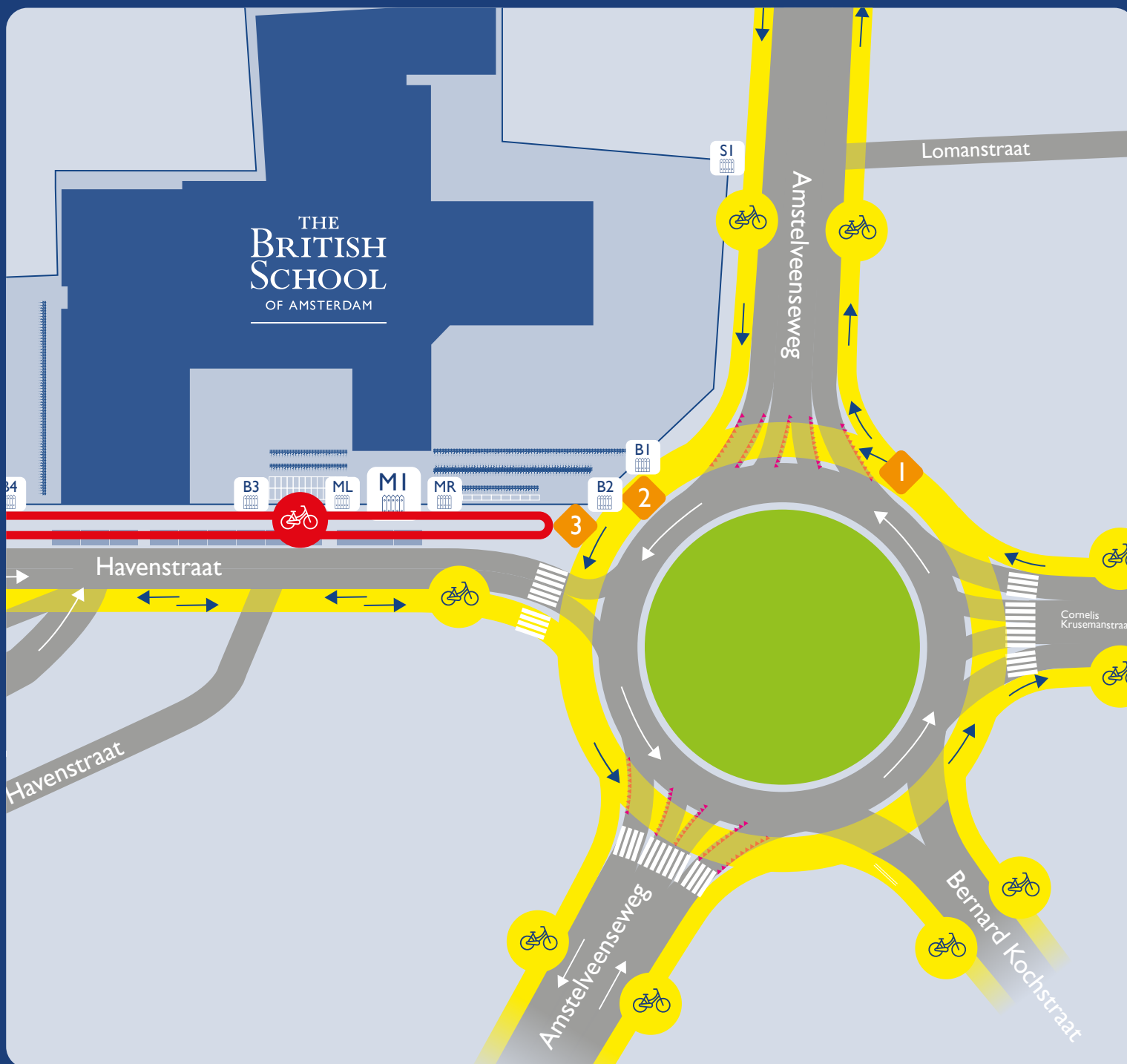
Caution: No yield but watch for merging traffic.

Final approach

When approaching the school please:

- 1 Keep left here to cross the roundabout on the north side.
- 2 - Signal right.
- Turn off the bike path (watch the kerb).
- Dismount and walk through the gate.
- 3 Pedestrian Zone, dismount bike.

Public transport

Our new school on Havenstraat is surrounded by great transport links, and is accessible directly by Bus and Tram and is connected indirectly by Train and Metro.



The school is in the process of organising a private bus company to collect pupils from pick up points. More communication on this will follow shortly.



Local transport stops are within a 4-minute walk from the school.

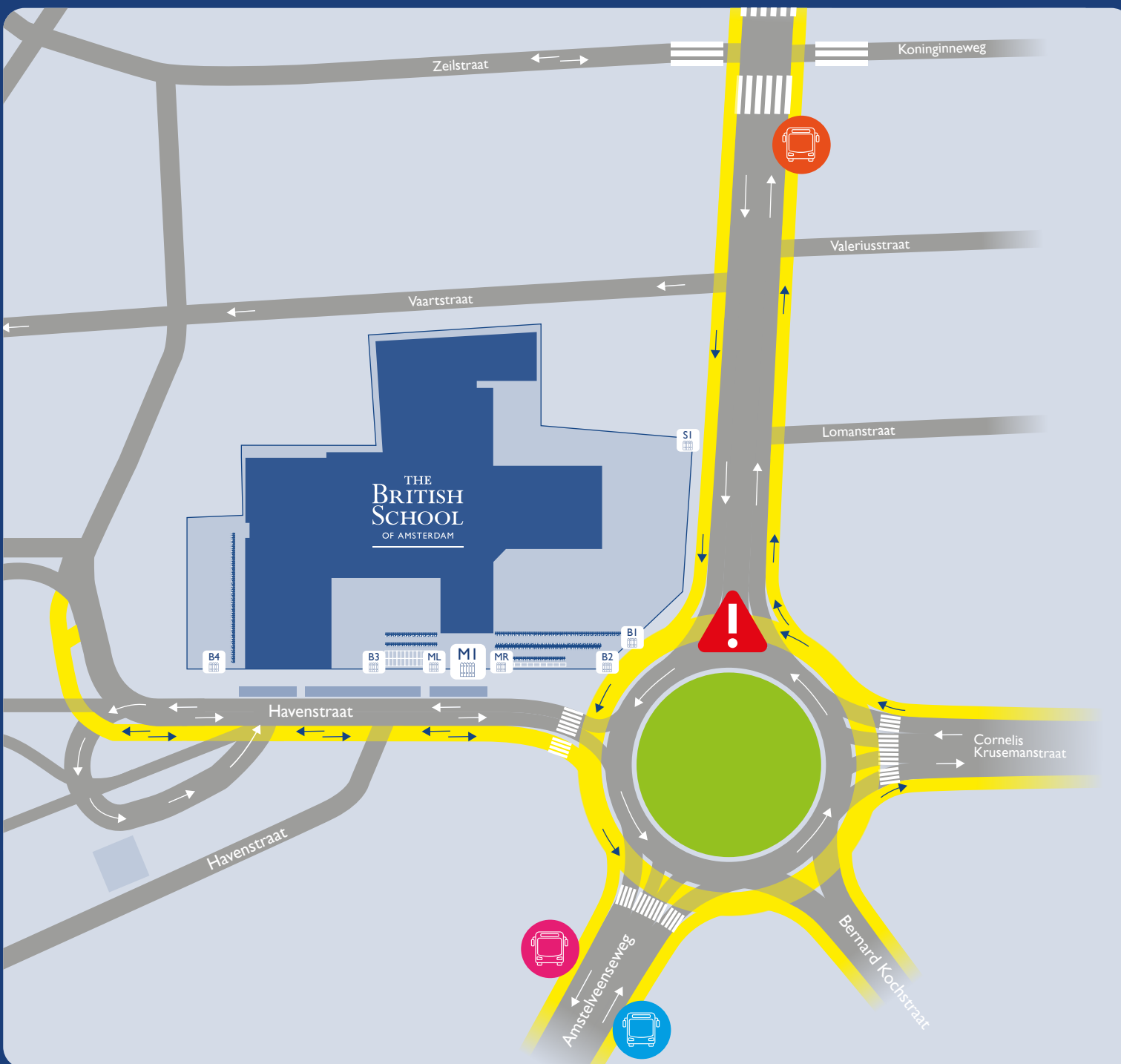

Haarlemmermeerstation



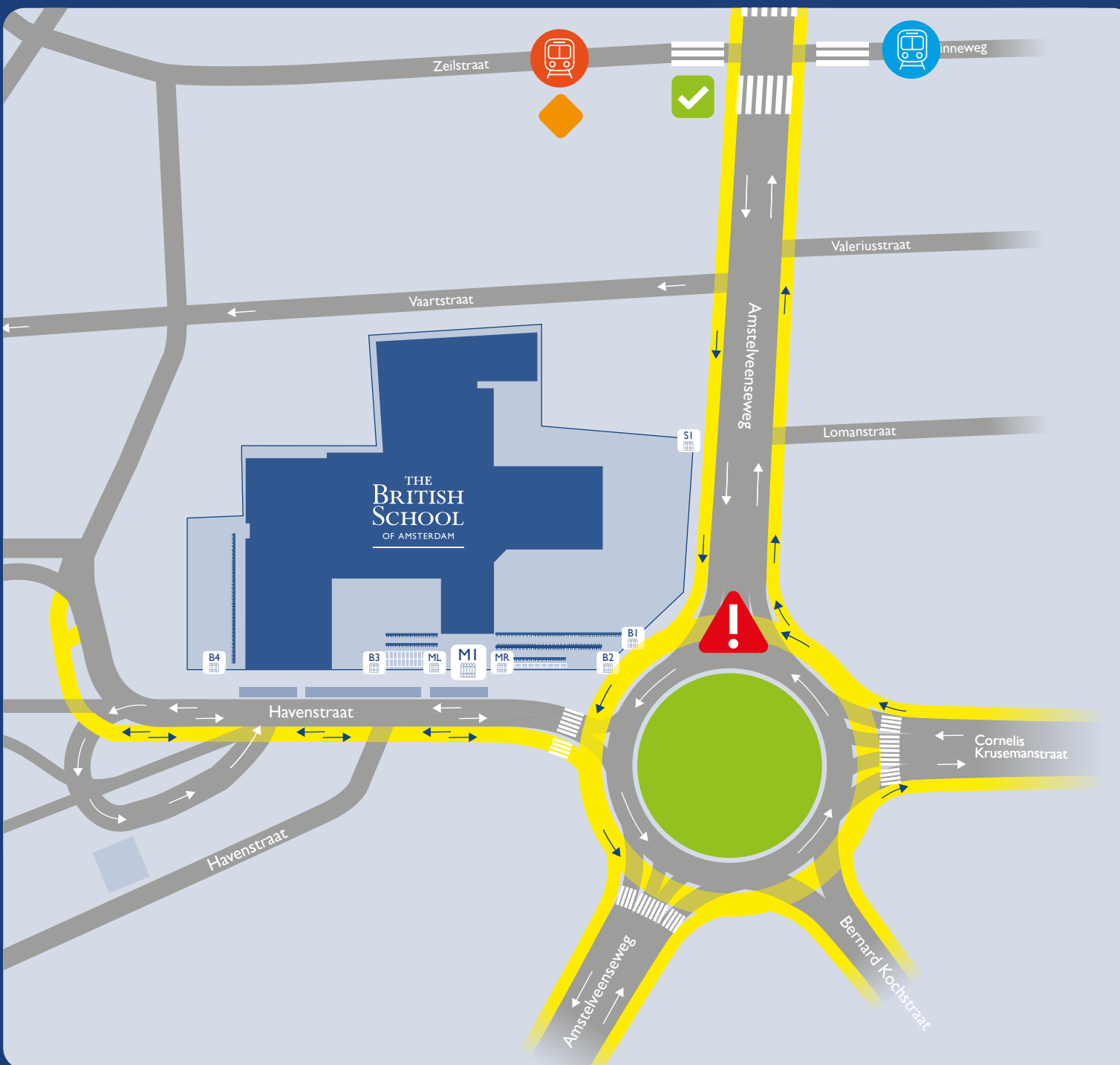
Bus 15 from Station Zuid.

Tram routes and stops

The tram stops are a 4 minute walk from the school.

Tram 2 from Nieuw Sloten.



Tram 2 from Central Station.



If arriving by Tram 2 from Nieuw Sloten, the Amstelveenseweg stop sets you down in the traffic, so please watch out for vehicles and cycles when disembarking.



If arriving by Tram 2 from Central Station, the only pedestrian crossing is at the lights at Amstelveenseweg/ Zeilstraat.



There is no pedestrian crossing here - Do not cross.

Arriving by car

Driver Guidelines

Where possible we would ask parents not to travel by car, but if necessary then please take note of the following;



✓ Car Pool Update

Sharing the commute to and from school will reduce congestion. To encourage more of our community to car pool we will be setting up a car pool notice board on Firefly.

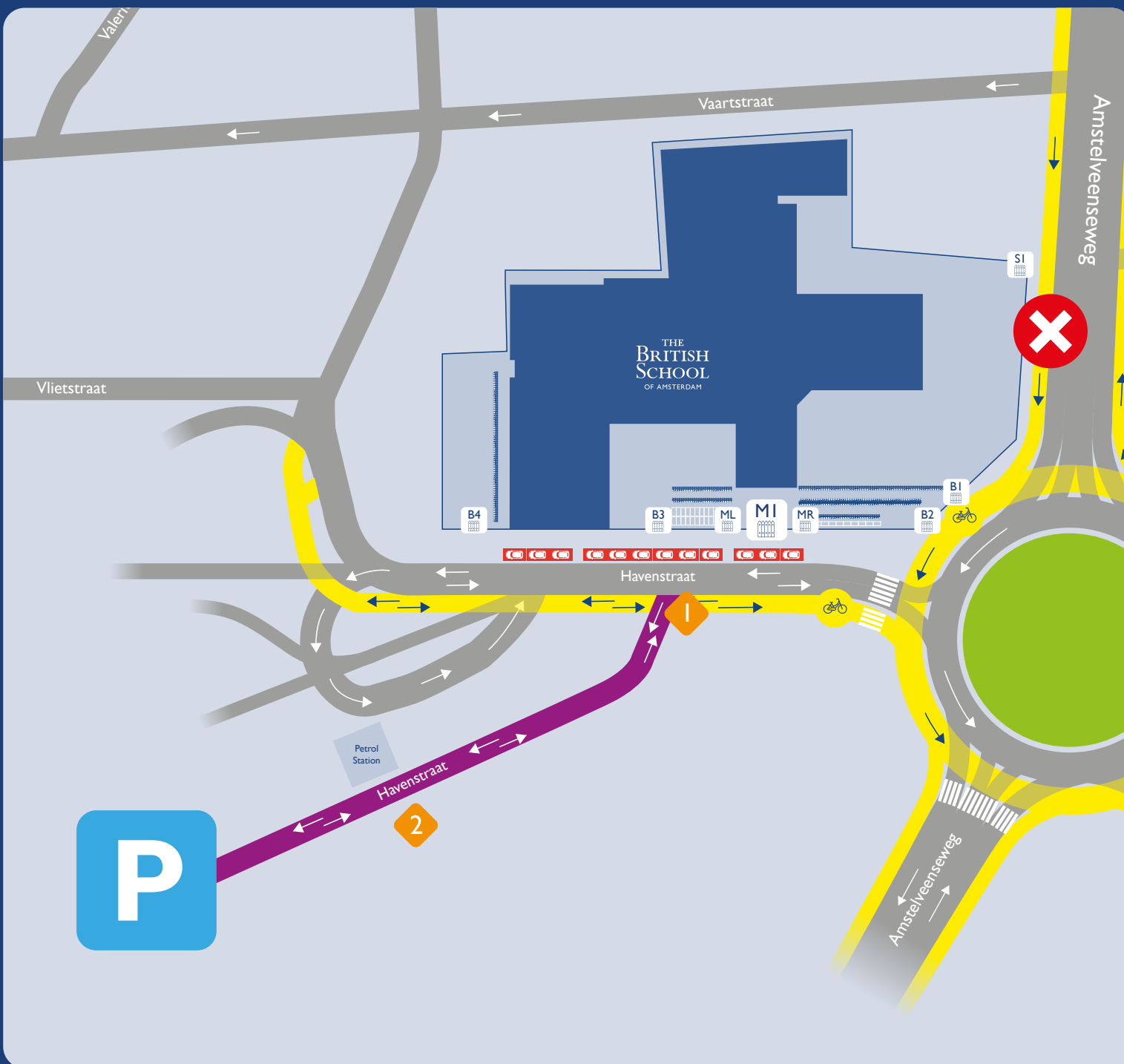
✓ Car Parking Guidelines

Please find local parking if:

- You have children in Nursery up to Year 4.
- You need to talk with a member of staff.
- Your child needs assistance to enter or leave school.







✓ Express (for pupils in Year 5 upwards) Kiss & Ride Zone Rules

- The Express Kiss & Ride Zone is not suitable for children in Year 4 or below.
- Pupils must be able to leave the car and enter school grounds **INDEPENDENTLY** (you may not leave your vehicle and there will NOT be any school staff on hand to assist).
- Pupils must be able to exit the school grounds and wait **UNSUPERVISED** for pick up (you may not leave your vehicle and there will NOT be any school staff on hand to assist).
- This is strictly a **NO PARKING ZONE**.
- Drivers may not leave the vehicle unattended, if you need to come in to school you will need to park elsewhere.
- There is no waiting in this zone, only stop in this zone when your child is ready to enter the vehicle.



Parking your car

There is a small paid for car park,
down a lane, a 3 minute walk from
the school.

-  Parking charges are €6 per hour (free if you have a residential parking permit for parking zones Zuid 2 and Zuid 8).
-  You can check parking zone information by clicking [here](#).
-  Useful parking apps: Parkmobile and Parkbee.
-  There is strictly no parking in the taxi rank.
-  Caution - drivers must watch for crossing cyclists.
-  2 No pavement (sidewalk) for pedestrians.

school independently.

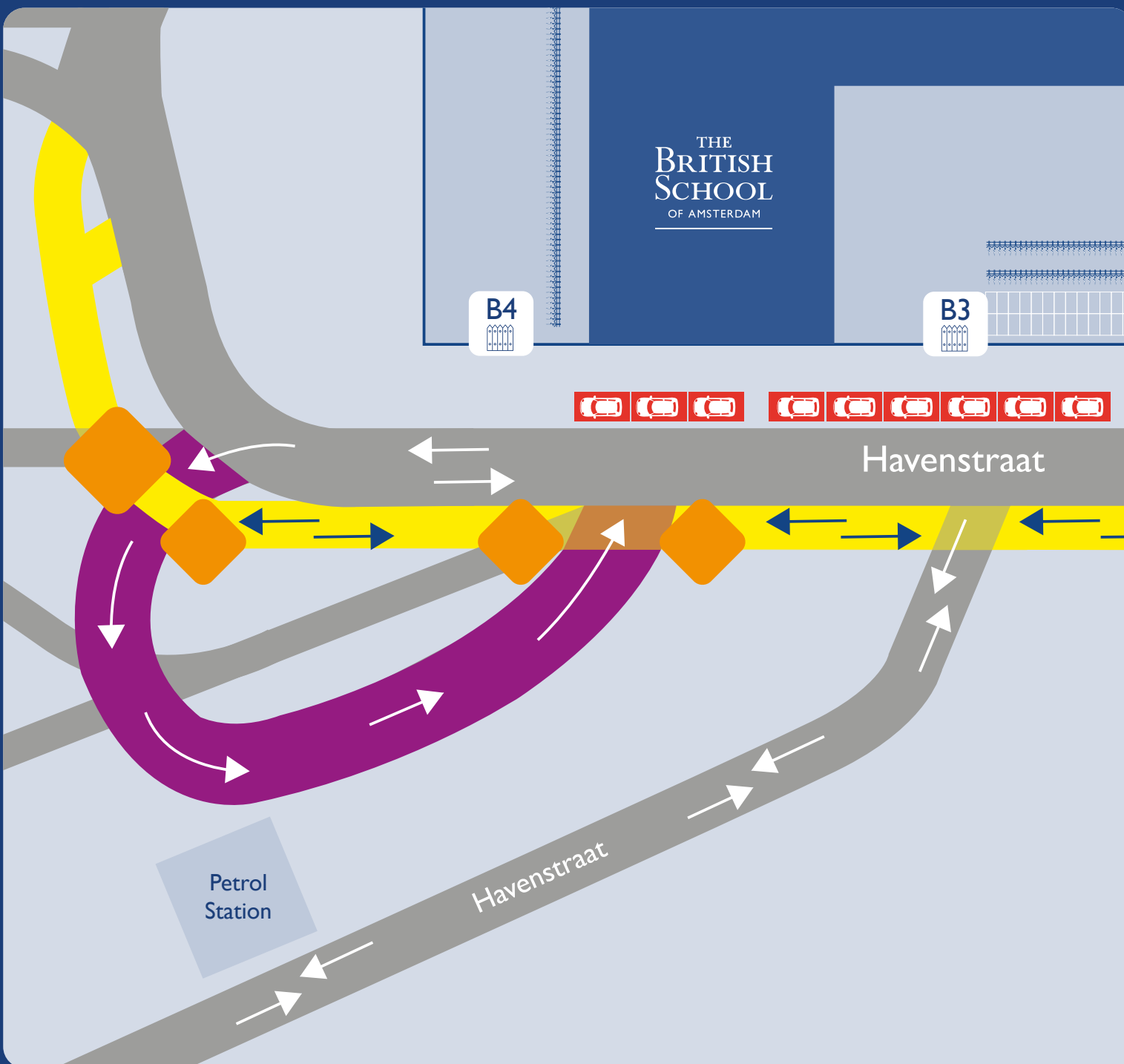
There is no waiting allowed
